About OESI

Description

Ohio Environmental Service Industries (OESI) is a trade association of Ohio's commercial hazardous waste management facilities and associated businesses. The hazardous waste management companies provide chemical recycling, treatment and disposal services; the associated businesses provide services related to the industry. OESI holds six meetings each year in Columbus or at a member facility to discuss legislative, regulatory and communication issues affecting the industry. The association advocates before the state legislature and Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) regarding legislation or regulations pertinent to member facilities.

- OESI active members are commercial hazardous waste management facilities. Together, they process more than 600,000 tons (that's 1.2 billion pounds) of hazardous waste each year, which represents nearly 70% of the total hazardous waste handled commercially in Ohio.
- OESI associate members provide support services such as transportation, drum cleaning, environmental insurance, education, training, legal counsel, risk communication and engineering services.

Active Members:

OESI active members use state-of-the art methods for recycling, distilling, blending, destroying or disposing of used chemicals and hazardous wastes. They advocate chemical recovery, reuse and recycling wherever possible, as well as sound methods for treating and disposing of hazardous wastes. Members' operations are primarily regulated by the federal Resource Conservation Recovery Act (RCRA) through permits issued by the Ohio EPA.

Legislative Update 2000

During 2000, the OESI Legislative Committee worked on one major legislative issue and held periodic meetings with other regulated businesses and legislators. These activities are outlined below:

RCRA Direct Final Rule

OESI developed and drafted proposed legislation to create a RCRA Direct Final Rule process at the state level. The proposed legislation would give the Ohio EPA permissive authority to duplicate federal RCRA hazardous waste rules in a timely and efficient manner (see Legislative Agenda 2001 for further details).

Senate Bill 263 was introduced by Senator Doug White and referred to the Senate Environment Committee. The Environment Committee held two hearings on Senate Bill 263; however, time ran out before the close of the 123rd General Assembly. Senator White plans to reintroduce the Direct Final Rule legislation during the 124th General Assembly.

Monthly Business-To-Business Meetings

OESI representatives met monthly with other regulated business representatives to discuss current and ongoing legislative and regulatory activities that could affect OESI members. These interest groups included the Ohio Chemical Council (now the Ohio Chemistry Technology Council), the Ohio Manufacturers' Association and the Ohio Chamber of Commerce. Together with OESI representatives, these and other trade associations help communicate and respond to governmental officials regarding the impact of new rules, policies and legislation on Ohio's environmental service businesses.

Periodic Legislator Meetings

Throughout 2000, OESI representatives met with members of the House and Senate Environment Committees to familiarize them with OESI and issues affecting the hazardous waste management industry in Ohio.

Legislative Agenda 2001

During 2001, the OESI Legislative Committee plans to work on a number of issues affecting the commercial hazardous waste management industry. These issues are outlined below:

RCRA Direct Final Rule

OESI has proposed the introduction of legislation, which if enacted, would create a RCRA Direct Final Rule process at the state level.

The proposed legislation would give the Ohio EPA permissive authority to duplicate federal RCRA hazardous waste rules in a timely and efficient manner.

The U.S Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) has allocated the regulation of Ohio's hazardous waste industry to the Ohio EPA. When federal hazardous waste rules are modified, the state's rules have to be updated and at a minimum be "equivalent to" the new federal rule. The proposed legislation would provide authority to the director of the Ohio EPA allowing the ability to expedite the rule process in cases where Ohio EPA expects to precisely implement the adopted federal rule.

Any affected party will be given the opportunity to submit an adverse comment to the director regarding the Ohio EPA's intention to implement the rule through the expedited process. If an adverse comment is submitted, the exposed rule would have to be adopted by the normal Joint Committee on Agency Rule Review (JCARR) process.

The requirements of the proposed legislation allow proposed rules to be adopted via the Direct Final Rule process and to become effective 30 days after the Ohio EPA circulates the rule to interested parties and makes public notification of the rule making process. If the director does not receive an adverse comment, the rule will become effective at the end of the 30-day period.

Additional legislative priorities:

- Improve Ohio EPA's permit review and issuance process
- Evaluate Ohio EPA's on-site inspector policy
- Work to extend Ohio Lien Law to environmental services
- Establish a Statute of Limitation on Notices of Violation (NOVs) enforcement
- Monitor legislation regarding the implementation of Issue 1: Clean Ohio Fund
- Promote reconsideration of solid waste permit moratorium and public policy.

Regulatory Update 2000

During 2000, the OESI Regulatory/Compliance Committee worked on a number of regulatory issues. These are outlined below:

Waste Analysis Plan Guidance

OESI provided comments — both written and verbal — to the Ohio EPA on its new Waste Analysis Plan (WAP) guidance document for treatment, storage and disposal facilities (TSDFs). The WAP guidance instructs TSDFs how to prepare WAPs, which are facility plans for classifying waste coming on site. WAPs are submitted by every TSDF as part of their RCRA Part B permit application or permit renewals. OESI members submitted comments to Ohio EPA during the document's public comment period. Group members also met with Ohio EPA representatives on March 13, 2000, to discuss their concerns with the guidance document. When the final document was published last spring, the Ohio EPA had incorporated some of the OESI changes. "We're not unhappy with the final guidance, but only time will tell how well it will work as facilities prepare or modify their WAPs," said Jim Gress, OESI's president.

Issue 1: Clean Ohio Fund

OESI supported the successful Issue 1: Clean Ohio Fund, which was approved in November 2000. Issue 1 provides \$400 million in funds for brownfields development and conservation.

Toxic Release Inventory (TRI) Program

OESI members reported Toxic Release Inventory (TRI) data in July 2000 for reporting year 1999. This was the second year of reporting for OESI members and other hazardous waste management facilities under the federal Emergency Planning and Community Right-To-Know Act. The U.S. EPA recently published 1999 data that shows the hazardous waste management industry accounts for only 3.7 percent of TRI total releases.

Stricter Discharge Limits on Wastewater

In December 2000, the U.S. EPA issued stricter pollutant discharge limits for certain sources of wastewater. "This new regulation will have a major impact on our industry," said Dan McCabe, chair of the OESI Regulatory/Compliance Committee. "It greatly restricts what can be discharged to a municipal wastewater treatment plant." Under this new rule, certain industries will be required to perform additional pretreatment of wastewater (tertiary treatment) to remove organic and inorganic pollutants before discharge to a municipal treatment plant. The new rule takes effect December 22, 2003.

Regulatory Agenda 2001

During 2001, the OESI Regulatory/Compliance Committee plans to work on a number of issues affecting the commercial hazardous waste management industry. These issues are outlined below:

On-Site Ohio EPA Inspectors

In Ohio, four facilities currently host full-time, on-site Ohio EPA inspectors. All four are OESI members. OESI has three concerns with this practice:

- Ohio EPA does not have a clear rationale for placement of on-site inspectors.
- Each facility, not Ohio EPA, must pay for the annual cost of the inspector.
- Expected streamlining of the administrative process has not occurred.

OESI supports a re-examination of Ohio EPA's on-site inspection and monitoring program.

Notices of Violation

The Ohio EPA conducts facility inspections and issues Notices of Violation (NOVs) when it finds violations. Fines often accompany the NOVs. OESI has one major concern with this policy:

- The Ohio EPA has no appeals process for NOVs because they are not considered an "action of the director."

OESI supports an appeal process for NOVs.

Regulatory Agenda 2001 (continued)

Ohio EPA Review of PE-Certified Plans

The Ohio EPA currently has a policy of requiring the signature and seal of a Professional Engineer (PE) on engineering-type plans submitted for approval. As a result, facilities must hire an independent PE to certify documents containing tank calculations or engineering drawings, such as Spill Prevention, Control and Countermeasure (SPCC) plans or RCRA permit applications and modifications. OESI has one concern regarding this policy:

- When the document is received by Ohio EPA, it is not always being reviewed by an Ohio EPA PE. Sometimes, these non-PE reviewers challenge the engineering content of documents that have been certified by the facility's PE.

OESI supports the review of engineering-type documents by Ohio EPA PEs; however, if a non-PE is going to review the document, then Ohio EPA and the facility should agree on the appropriate level of engineering detail.

VAP Program Analysis Procedures

The Ohio EPA currently requires specialized procedures for analyzing contaminants in soil and groundwater through its Voluntary Action Program (VAP). OESI has one major concern with this policy:

- By requiring special methods, laboratories must spend extra time and effort to reconfigure equipment and complete paperwork.

OESI supports the VAP adopting SW846 (U.S. EPA methods) or equivalent methods proven to be accurate to allow greater flexibility in the program.

Communication Update 2000

During 2000, the OESI Communication/Education Committee completed several tasks. These are outlined below:

New Website

In early 2000, OESI launched and updated a new website. Located at www.oesionline.org, the website is designed to enhance communication among OESI members and to provide further education to legislators and the public about OESI initiatives and services. It features news about members and events, services provided by members, the most recent newsletter and links to state, federal and other related agencies and associations.

Newsletter and Membership Directory

In April 2000, OESI developed a newsletter and Membership Directory, which provided up-to-date information on legislative and regulatory initiatives undertaken by OESI, as well as a list of current members and services provided.

Communication Agenda 2001

During 2001, the OESI Communication/Education Committee plans to conduct several tasks. These are outlined below:

Legislative Update by Email

In early 2001, OESI began issuing monthly legislative updates to its members and other interested parties by email. These updates examine new legislative initiatives that could impact our members and their operations. If you would like to receive a monthly update, please visit the website to sign up.

Annual Report and Membership Directory

Beginning in 2001 with this publication, OESI is issuing a combined Annual Report and Membership Directory. We will continue to prepare a combined report in the spring of each year.

Supporting Local Schools

Throughout the year, OESI is encouraging members to develop programs to support local schools wherever possible, but particularly in the areas of environmental science, engineering and stewardship.

Membership Update 2000
